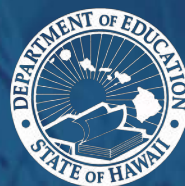

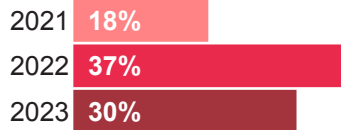

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

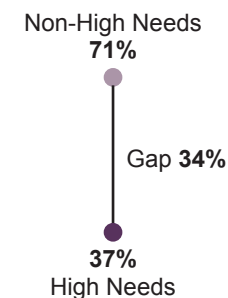
29% of English Learner students are on-track to English Language Proficiency.
