

#### Math Proficiency


Percent of students demonstrating proficiency on statewide mathematics assessments.






### **On-Time High School Graduation**

Percent of students graduating with a high school diploma ontime (i.e., 4 year adjusted cohort graduation rate).




# Extended High School Completion<sup>#</sup>

Percent of graduates enrolling in a postsecondary educational institution by the following fall.




